


I liked using the tape to attach my fabrics. (Mrs L: You did fantastic sewing too!)



Hello From Forest School



The children have also made their own feed strings using breakfast cereals. We kept the theme of birds throughout the sessions and completed clay birds, giant bird nests in Jetty Fields and also wild bird art using natural materials. The children have really enjoyed looking at the wildlife that visits the school grounds and helping to take care of it by providing the right kind of foodstuffs for our birds.
